Each year, on the third weekend of september, the "Jurats" go to the top of the tower and announce the opening of the harvest season. The day ends with a great banquet. In the Middle Ages, Saint-Émilion was a vibrant trading town, surrounded by a city wall and vineyards. Since 1999, this exceptional heritage has been protected, as well as the French gastronomy (since 2010)! Find the symbol and the name of the organisation in charge of this protection on the bell tower. Write the letters below:  Answer:	5 Stop in front of the map of Saint-Émilion's Jurisdiction.
